


Poverty in LAC has (finally) been falling...

But inequality remains very high...


Income inequality in Latin American countries
(Gini coefficient, circa 2004-2005)





Inequality (Ginis) before and after taxes and transfers




And Inequality Polarizes Politics...



Two Latin-American Children: Probability of completing sixth grade on time




Two Paraguayan Children: Probability of having potable water in the house




Two Uruguayan Children:

Two Chilean Children: Probability of Access to Computers




Two Argentinean Children:

Índice de Oportunidades Humanas

$$O = \bar{p} (1 - D)$$

→ Acceso promedio (\bar{p})

→ Desigualdad de Oportunidades (D)



$$D = \frac{1}{2\bar{p}} \sum_{i=1}^m \beta_i |p_i - \bar{p}|$$

\bar{p} Acceso promedio

p_i Acceso específico por grupo i

β_i Proporción del grupo i en la población total
