#### Research Assistant Intern to Scholar Angela Ajodo-Adebanjoko

Hadiza Musa had the incredible opportunity to work alongside Professor Angela Ajodo-Adebanjoko on the Voice of the Vulnerable: Women Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism in Nigeria project. This experience not only deepened her understanding of the complexities surrounding violent extremism but also enriched her research and communication skills in profound ways. Key Highlights of Her Contributions: In-Depth Research: Compiled and analyzed over 30 scholarly pieces of literature on the Boko Haram conflict, focusing on the roles and resilience of women in preventing and countering violent extremism. Qualitative Analysis: Transcribed and thematically analyzed audio interviews, transforming raw data into actionable insights for the project's ongoing research. Skill Development: Attended a media training workshop led by John Milewski, where she got advice on developing effective communication skills and learned strategies to share complex ideas with diverse audiences.

### Kristen Marcinek

#### Staff Assistant Intern, Serious Games Initiative

Kristen worked for the Serious Games Initiative for all three semesters in 2024. Her work included blog posts entitled <u>Games Round Up: International Trade</u> and <u>Empowering</u> <u>Participation in Science: A Citizen Science Landscape</u>, contributions to the design and research for <u>The Deepfake Files</u>, and leadership of the Games Get Serious monthly program teaching the Wilson Center about serious games. Of particular note, Kristen created curriculum alignment for <u>The Plastic</u> <u>Pipeline</u>, which <u>won several awards</u> at the 2024 Serious Games Festival.

Fall saw a lot of effort put towards the 20th Anniversary of the Serious Games Initiative, including interviewing experts in serious games and planning and hosting the anniversary arcade event. Kristen was a great asset, helping programs run some events, supporting the Serious Games Initiative's existing portfolio and seeing many of the games receive accolades, and supporting the Federal Games Guild.





#### Staff Assistant Intern, Korea Center

Hyunseung assisted staff research, administrative tasks, and event preparation. Hyunseung also conducted individual research about South Korea's pursuit of nuclear spent fuel reprocessing capability and its implications. He made weekly newsletter related to the Korean Peninsula affairs.

She also had an article published with <u>The Diplomat</u>.

Samantha engaged in a variety of impactful projects and events. She conducted multiple interviews with Wilson Scholars on topics such as the Peace Lab, Ukraine, the International Criminal Court system, and transnational organized crime in Central America and Mexico, producing articles and drafting social media content to highlight their work. Samantha participated in roundtables with Ambassador Green and scholars focused on gender, refugees, and hate crimes, and attended discussions on critical issues such as Russian disinformation and European security with distinguished speakers, including a former MI6 director and Finland's former foreign minister. Additionally, she contributed to the Scholar Profiles Project, helped create internfocused events, evaluated staff intern applications, and worked on the development of the new Wilson Center website. Samantha's experience culminated in the Intern Showcase, where she presented her work and the skills she gained throughout this enriching internship.

Research Assistant Intern to Scholar Ruth Greenspan Bell

Sophie worked with scholar Ruth Greenspan Bell to research the intersection of climate change and behavioral science. She helped with a book proposal by developing a literature review that outlined relevant takeaways from comparable titles. Throughout the internship, Sophie's research explored topics ranging from individual decision-making for social good to the effectiveness of carbon tracking apps.
